After the first lots were sold in 1892, I. R. Holmes (President of the La Porte Land and Town Company) served as the town manager. Mrs. Alice Marsh, who served as secretary for the syndicate, was appointed city clerk, and Col. A. M. York was treasurer.

After the City was chartered in 1892, J. H. York served as Mayor and John Beasley, E. P. Seureau, T. W. Lee, C. G. Woodbridge, and J. W. Alexander served as Councilmen. The Houston Daily Post, in an article dated April 4, 1894, states that the 1894 was the second election held in La Porte. For these reasons it is difficult to say just who the first Mayor of La Porte was.

Mayors were elected yearly until a charter revision of March 3, 1916, declared that they be elected every two years.
